The Modern Context of Integrative Medicine (100 hours - 10 credits)

What better way of starting your integrative healthcare journey by diving into the history of traditional medicine and whole medicine systems, from early human existence to the present day diverse global cultures. You will consider the social, cultural and political developments underpinning the evolution of healing and medicine, and learn about major healthcare advances. This module is an important foundation for learners to understand the role of the modern healthcare practitioner within the wider healthcare system.

Learning Outcomes

- 1) Summarise the history of healing and the evolution of medicine from diverse cultures, the interrelationships among separate healing paradigms and their common ground.
- 2) Critically discuss how the changing ideas and perspectives about health overtime relate to the present landscape of integrative medicine and healthcare around the world.
- 3) Critically evaluate the history and understanding of health and disease according to different cultural and historical frameworks.

Assessment

Reflective Account: Learners create a reflective account of an aspect of traditional medicine that interests them. (2000 words)

Critical Appraisal of Medicine and Integrative Medicine Research (100 hours - 10 credits)

This module equips you with valuable research skills and an understanding of research methods relevant to integrative medicine. Learners apply critical appraisal tools to evaluate qualitative and quantitative research papers. In the module you will discuss the complexities of integrative healthcare research studies and how new methods are emerging to fully evaluate them.

Learning Outcomes

- 1) Critically appraise selected studies relevant to own area of practice.
- 2) Demonstrate in-depth understanding of the use of critical appraisal tools to evaluate research.
- 3) Critically review a range of evaluation methodologies to support own practice.

Assessment

Written Assignment: Learners write an essay critically appraising an area of research relating to their practice. (2000 words)
